

KITCHEN INSPECTIONS

Section 111 of the Child Nutrition and WIC Reauthorization Act of 2004 (Public Law 108-265) amended the National School Lunch Act regarding food safety inspections required in all schools participating in the National School Lunch or School Breakfast program. In, Pennsylvania, all public school districts and an additional 400 non-public schools and residential student facilities voluntarily participate in the National School Lunch program.

Previously, according to federal law, participating schools were required to obtain a minimum of one food safety inspection per school year or comply with more stringent food safety inspection standards established at the local level. Beginning July 1, 2005 each school building must now obtain at least two food safety inspections each school year. The inspections must be conducted by a State or local governmental agency responsible for food safety inspections. In Pennsylvania, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture-Bureau of Food Safety and Laboratory Service is the responsible agency for conducting the safety inspections. In addition, schools must post, in a publicly visible location, and provide a copy of the food safety inspection to a member of the public upon request.

The mandate for schools to have two food safety inspections is the work of the United States Congress rather than any Commonwealth of Pennsylvania agency.

Penn Manor School District will make every effort to comply with the new change to the regulations. Shown below are the more recent scores of our school buildings regarding food safety inspections.
