Penn Manor School District Offers Credit Card Payments

The Penn Manor School District, through Official Payments Corp., will now be able to accept credit card tax payments. The system went live in early July, Penn Manor School District taxpaying citizens are able to pay taxes via Internet by visiting www.officialpayments.com, or via telephone by calling toll-free 1-800-2PAY-TAX. American Express, Discover Card, MasterCard and Visa are the cards accepted by the program.

Official Payments Corp. charges taxpayers a convenience fee for processing these credit card transactions. The fee schedule can be found on the Internet at www.officialpayments.com. For example, a taxpayer who owed the Penn Manor School District \$1,500 in real estate taxes and charged their taxes would find a total of \$1,549 on their credit card statement: \$1,500 for the tax bill and \$49 for the convenience fee. Taxpayers using credit cards with bonus rewards programs can, depending on their card's program, earn rewards, points, and cash-back or airline frequent flyer miles for paying their taxes. ★

Bridged by Books

The Discover students at LeTort Elementary designed a school-wide reading program. The purpose of the program was to unite the student population to celebrate reaching a goal of reading 6,209 books. The reading goal was determined by calculating how many books laid end-to-end would "bridge" the gap between the two middle schools where the LeTort students were housed.

The students not only met but also exceeded the goal by 10%. The Penn Manor Education Foundation funded the celebration through an Author-In-Residence grant. Local author Kathleen Pennell spent the entire day on May 10 with the students of LeTort. The students also participated in various activities such as making hats from the thousands of bookslips used to record their reading progress, playing human "book" tic-tac-toe, competing in "Who Wants to be an Author?" and enjoying an ice cream treat provided in part by Turkey Hill Dairy. ★

NASA Videoconference

On May 9, 2002 ten Manor Middle students, three teachers and several parents attended a videoconference with the NASA Glenn Research Center and middle school students from Berrien County, Michigan. The videoconference was made possible through the use of the distance-learning laboratory at Penn Manor High School. NASA presenter Robert Skupinski discussed humanoid robots, industrial robots, telerobotics, and autonomous robots. Penn Manor students were able to dialogue with Mr. Skupinski and the students at the other remote sites via live video. The students were also able to operate a robot in Ohio by simply clapping into a microphone at our location.

This opportunity was made possible through the efforts of our Penn Manor technology staff and the middle school gifted teacher, Barb St. John. Penn Manor will be building on the success of the live NASA conference by exploring more interactive video-learning experiences in the coming months. ★



GIRLS' SOCCER

The 2002 Penn Manor Girls' Soccer Team broke many school records this year in their most successful season ever in school history. Their final record of 25-2-2 established a new team victory record breaking the record 19 wins in the 2001 season. Along with the 25 victories, they have also had 20 team shutouts, which places them in the top 5 in the PIAA record book.

The season started with a 1-1 tie with Manheim Township and a 1-0 loss to the defending state champion, Council Rock. After that, their season took off. The team won its second straight Lancaster-Lebanon League Section I title with a 10-1-1 record. They also won their second straight Lancaster-Lebanon League title by posting three straight shutouts in the League playoffs. In the District 3 tournament, they beat Twin Valley and Mechanicsburg to qualify for states for the second straight year. In the semifinals, they defeated powerhouse Cumberland Valley and then Elco in the District finals winning their first ever District 3 crown.

In state play, PM beat Parkland and Manheim Township to advance to the State Championship final against perennial favorite, Council Rock. In a hard fought contest, PM and Council Rock were declared co-state champions after regulation play ended in a 1-1 tie and remained scoreless after 4 sudden death overtimes.
