Educators/Employees of the Year Announced for 2003/04

The Penn Manor School District employs over 600 full time and part time employees. Each employee is valuable, but four individuals are singled out at the annual Employee Recognition Banquet held in late April to receive special awards for their outstanding contributions.

Two educators, one from elementary and one from secondary, are chosen from all of the district educators nominated by students and parents as Outstanding Educators of the Year. This award has been given since 1980. The intent is to recognize outstanding educators who have dedicated their time and efforts to help their students excel academically and to succeed in life.

This year's Outstanding Elementary Educator is Larisa Garpstas. Larisa is currently a 1st grade teacher at Hambricht Elementary. Larisa is a product of the

Penn Manor School District. She attended Hambricht Elementary, Marticville Middle School and graduated from Penn Manor High School in 1991. Larisa attended Penn State University graduating in 1995. She

has been employed by the Penn Manor School District for the past 8 years. Larisa spent 6 years teaching 4th grade at Hambricht before making the move to 1st grade. Larisa and her husband, Robert, have two young daughters age 9 and 4. Larisa will complete her Masters in Reading and Language Arts this summer at Millersville University.

The Outstanding Secondary Educator is Lisa Bitler. Lisa is a Learning Support teacher at Marticville Middle School. She is very involved with the students at Marticville serving as the Serteen advisor, Yearbook advisor and school store manager. She has worked for the Penn Manor School District for the past 8 years.

Lisa earned her undergraduate degree at Millersville University and her Masters in Education at Wilkes University. She and her husband, Rick, have two grown children.

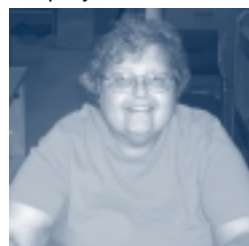

Girls Soccer

The Penn Manor Girls Soccer Team ended with a 17-5-4 season record. The team beat Hempfield in the L-L League Championship match. After tying 1-1 at the end of the regulation and 4 over-times the Comets outscored the Black Knights on penalty shots to win the championship. Senior Karrine Riggins was voted to First Team All Star L-L League, was top 5 in history of PA for career shutouts and tied for first in PA in most shutouts in a season. Senior Jenny DeGeorge was voted 1st Team All-Star L-L League along with Junior Kasie Shover who was also named Section I MVP; L-L League MVP; All State Player and nominated for All-American honors. Junior Steph Fisher was voted 2nd Team All-Star.

Boys Volleyball

The Penn Manor Boys Volleyball Team, with a primarily junior cast, had its most successful season since the 1998 and 1999 seasons. Led by the consistent play of junior setter Kevin Steinkirchner, the Comets forged their way into the playoffs, capturing 2nd place in Leagues and falling just short of a State berth. Ending the season with an impressive 34-13-4 overall match record (88-45 in games) and 8-4 Section match record (25-12 in games), the Comets proved themselves to be a team to be reckoned with. While the boys will suffer the loss of two great seniors Mitch Crawford and Drue Miles, it is exciting to see seven juniors and one sophomore returning. Ranked as high as 15th in the state, the Comets contended with some of the top-ranked teams in the state. Individually, five juniors made their way onto the All-Section team, with Kevin Steinkirchner getting First Team; Dan Reist, Ashlin

Hollinger and T.J. Purcell being named to Second Team; and Chris Staub making Third Team. The Comets expect to end next year as a top-ranked team in the state.

Baseball

The Penn Manor baseball team completed a very successful season with an impressive 20-5 record. The squad finished the regular season tied with Hempfield and went on to defeat the Black Knights 12-4 in a one game play-off to win the Section Title for the first time since 1979. The Comets beat Cocalico and Annville-Cleona in League Playoffs but lost the Lancaster-Lebanon title game to Hempfield. The Comets moved into district play by defeating Dover 6-4 behind the strong pitching of juniors Shawn Yohe and Josh Squatrito. The team lost to Chambersburg in a very exciting second round game 4-2.

Seniors Dan Kauffman, Dan Ott, Alan Smith, Nick Spisak, Phil Texter, Brent Wile and Cody Wile were all instrumental in helping the Comets achieve the success they have enjoyed the past two seasons.

Kauffman, Spisak and Texter were named Section One All-Stars, while Smith and Squatrito were Honorable Mention picks.

The Comets look to continue their winning ways next year with 8 returning players and a JV team that completed a 13-6 season.

Softball

The Comet softball team finished this season at 7-9 in Section One, good enough for 3rd place. This was the highest finish for a Penn Manor softball squad since the 1999 section championship team. The highlight of the season was a 2-1 victory over defending District Three champion Warwick. The Comets were led by senior first-basemen Lindsay Hess. Lindsay batted .416 with 9 extra base hits and 16 RBI's. Senior outfielder Abby Dickerman batted .328 and was stellar in the field recording 70 putouts. Senior Jenna Arment and junior Katie Butzer(.306) combined with Dickerman to form what was arguably the best outfield in the L-L league. Senior pitcher Erica Smith (25k's) and junior pitcher Nikki Zimmerman (9 RBI's) com-

bined with junior catcher Megan Denlinger (.277) to form a solid battery. Junior Taylor Brown finished second in batting with a .341 avg.

The Comets return a solid nucleus of players for 2005 and look forward to an off season of hard work. The JV team finished 8-8 in section play.

Lunch tickets can be purchased with a check or through Cafe' Prepay, an online prepay site computerized school cafeteria system that allows you to use your VISA, Mastercard or Discover Card to prepay your child's lunches. Internet payments may be made in increments of \$34.00/elementary and \$37.00/secondary. A 6% handling fee is added to each prepay increment. Students will receive credit for an extra lunch for each 20 lunch increments purchased utilizing Café Prepay. Lunch tickets (purchased with a check or through Cafe' Prepay) can only be used to purchase a school lunch; all a la carte items must be paid for separately with cash.
