"Operation Recognition" Program

Penn Manor resident Robert Souders received his high school diploma from Superintendent Donald Stewart. Thanks to the State of Pennsylvania's Operation Recognition Act he was able to receive his diploma along with the Class of 2003. Measuring Our School District's Success

From the Desk of Mr. Donald Stewart



As we congratulate the outstanding members and award winners of the graduating class of 2003, it seems entirely appropriate to look back at the 2002-2003 school year and attempt to measure Penn Manor's level of success. With the graduation of our seniors, I mark the end of my first full year as Penn Manor's Superintendent of Schools, so for me personally, measuring our progress becomes twice as important.

The dilemma is that there are hundreds of ways to measure a school district's success. And while there are hundreds of ways, there may not be only one effective means to measure "how good are our schools."

Certainly our culture and our national and state policy makers are pointing to test scores as the ultimate measure. We are proud of the success of our students on the Pennsylvania Standardized Assessments. The report of writing scores published by the Lancaster Newspapers on May 13, 2003 indicated that our high school scored 3rd highest in the county. Three of the top five scoring elementary schools were from the Penn Manor School District. This is great news for us, but my experience is that parents and community members generally do not consider a one-time yearly test the best measure of schools.

Rather than by test scores, I believe you measure your schools by the

attitudes your children express about their school experiences and by the stories your children tell about what happens in their classrooms day to day. Essentially, I think that a parent measures a child's school by how much their child loves going there each day. This is because schools should be first and foremost places for children to experience connections, support, involvement and success.

Ultimately, we will be measured by how well we create school environments that fully embrace the children who walk our hallways.

For this reason I wish to give recognition for and accolades to Penn Manor's outstanding teachers and support staff members. They are the true measure of Penn Manor's success. And while we will continue to keep an eye on test scores, we will not forget that schools are most importantly about building relationships with children.

Parents Right to Know

As a parent or guardian of a student in the Penn Manor School District, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires the school district to give you this information in a timely manner if you ask for it. You have the right to ask for the following information:

- Has the Pennsylvania Department of Education licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he/she teaches?
- Has the Pennsylvania Department of Education decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances?
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any additional degrees, and if so, the subject(s) of the degrees.
- Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child, and if they do, their qualifications.

Baseball: Penn Manor completed their season with a very successful 13-9 record. The Comets finished second in Section One behind Hempfield and returned to the Lancaster-Lebanon league playoffs for the first time since 1979. The Comets won their quarter final game behind the 17 strikeout performance of Junior righthander, Phil Texter, defeating Annville-Cleona 4-2 before falling to eventual league champ Ephrata 7-0 in the semi-finals. The Comets also qualified for district play and lost in the first round to district champion Cumberland Valley 6-3 in eight innings. The Comets were led by team MVP, Junior Dan Kauffman—.407, 5 homeruns, 22 runs batted in; Junior Nick Spisak—.387, 29 hits; and Senior Brad Hess—.306, 4 homeruns and 16 runs batted in. On the mound, Senior Neil McConnell led the staff in wins with 4, followed by Junior Phil Texter with 3, Sophomores Shawn Yohe with 3, Josh Squatritro with 2 and Kyle Caruthers with 1. Hess and Kauffman were Section One all stars and Spisak, McConnell and catcher Dan Ott received honorable mentions. With seven starters returning the Comets look forward to the 2004 season.

Underclassmen Awards

Penn Manor's tenth annual Underclassmen Award Assembly was held on June 10, 2003, for 1300 freshmen, sophomores and juniors in the high school auditorium. Over 300 students were recognized for achievement in individual classes, perfect attendance, outside competitions and excellent grades. Awards were presented by the Agriculture, Business Technology, English, Foreign Language, Physical Education, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and Technology Education Departments.

Technology Challenge Bowl

Manor Middle School's team of **Kevin Brent**, **Justin Bradfield** and **Dan Servansky** competed in the National Middle School TSA Competition in Orlando. Teams demonstrate their knowledge of TSA, leadership skills, and the systems of technology by successfully completing written and oral testing. Each team member independently completes a written objective examination. Out of 378 participants, Kevin Brent finished with the highest score to take 1st place honors. The teams with the highest combined scores qualified for the oral head-to-head team competition phase of the event. Manor's team finished 6th out of 126 teams.

Walk-a-thon

Conestoga Elementary sixth grader **Wayne Markley** died tragically in a sledding accident this past winter. His sixth grade classmates at Conestoga Elementary organized a walk-a-thon to raise money to help purchase a headstone. The goal was to raise \$1,500. Through the efforts of the students and the support of community members, the students were

able to raise a total of \$3,883! The walk at Conestoga was held on April 24th. Many parents came to walk with the students and support their efforts. In response to state-wide legislation, the Penn Manor School District has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) plan for managing insects, rodents, and weeds. The purpose of the IPM is to protect every student from pesticide exposure by using a consistent protocol to pest management.

Penn Manor is proactive in its pest management efforts by making the school buildings and grounds an unfavorable habitat for these pests. Removing food and water sources and eliminating their hiding and breeding places are the best ways to combat pest infestations. This is best accomplished through routine cleaning and maintenance of the facilities.

The custodial and maintenance department routinely monitor the school buildings and grounds to detect any pests that are present. Pest sightings are reported to the district IPM coordinator and contracted service provider. Each will evaluate the situation and determine

the appropriate management techniques to address the problem. The techniques can include increased sanitation, modifying storage practices, sealing entry points, physically removing the pest, etc.

From time to time, it may be necessary to use pesticides registered by the Environmental Protection Agency to manage a pest problem. A pesticide will only be used when necessary, and will not be routinely applied.

When a pesticide is necessary, the school district will try to use the least toxic product that is effective. Applications will be made only when students do not have access to the area(s) being treated. Notices will be posted in these areas 72 hours prior to application and for 2 days following the application.

Parents or guardians of students enrolled in the school district may request prior notification of specific pesticide applications made at

the school building. To receive notification, you must be placed on the school's notification registry. If you would like to be placed on this registry, please complete the form above and mail to the Business Office. Please include your e-mail address if you would like to be notified electronically.

If a pest problem requires an emergency pesticide application, notice will be provided by telephone to any parent or guardian who has requested such notification in writing. Exemptions to this notification include disinfectants and antimicrobial products: self-contained baits placed in areas not accessible to students, and gel-type baits placed in cracks, crevices, or voids.
