<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>The Superintendent or designee shall prepare and implement procedures to implement the co-curricular program.</p>
<p>5. Guidelines</p>	<p>Guidelines shall ensure that the program of cocurricular activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Assesses the needs and interests of the district students. 2. Involve students in developing and planning extracurricular activities. 3. Is responsive to the articulated needs of students. 4. Ensures provision of competent guidance and supervision by staff. 5. Guards against exploitation of students. 6. Provides for continuing evaluation of the program and its components. 7. Ensures that all co-curricular activities are open to all students and that all students are fully informed of the opportunities open to them. <p><u>Code of Conduct</u></p> <p>122-AG Students are expected to abide by the specifics of the district's Code of Conduct.</p> <p><u>Equal Access Act</u></p> <p>P.L.98-377 The district shall provide secondary students the opportunity for noncurriculum related student groups to meet on the school premises during noninstructional time for the purpose of conducting a meeting within the limited open forum on the basis of the religious, political, philosophical, or other content of the speech at such meetings. Such meetings must be voluntary, student-initiated, and not sponsored in any way by the school, its agents or employees. Noninstructional time is the time set aside by the school before actual classroom instruction begins or after actual classroom instruction ends.</p>

The meetings cannot materially and substantially interfere with the orderly conduct of the educational activities in the school.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish the length of sessions, number per week, and other limitations felt reasonably necessary.

The district retains the authority to maintain order and discipline on school premises to protect the well-being of students and employees and to ensure that attendance of students at such meetings is voluntary.
